Can we be applicant in one project and co-applicants in several other projects or we can be applicant in one and co-applicant in only one project?</p>	<p>In GfA, Section 2.1.4.7 Number of applications and grants per applicants is stated: "The applicant may be a co-applicant in another application at the same time. A co-applicant may participate in only 1 (one) application under this Call for Proposals". If an operator submits more than one application as applicant or more than one application as co-applicant, all its applications will be rejected on this sole basis.</p>
2.	<p>I would like to ask you for the explanation of the rule 2.1.4.7. in Guideline "Number of applications and grants per applicants" The applicant may not submit more than 1 (one) application under this Call for Proposals. The applicant may not be awarded more than 1 (one) grant under this Call for Proposals. The applicant may be a co-applicant in another application at the same time. A co-applicant may participate in only 1 (one) application under this Call for Proposals. A co-applicant may participate in only 1 (one) grant awarded under this Call</p>	<p>As the Section 2.1.4.7 states, applicant may not be awarded more than 1 (one) grant under this Call for Proposals. It also states that applicant may not submit more than 1 (one) application under this Call for Proposals. At the same time, an applicant may participate as a co-applicant in one other application. A co-applicant may participate in only 1 (one) grant awarded under this Call for Proposals.</p>

<p>for Proposals. A co-applicant may be the applicant or an affiliated entity in another application at the same time. The affiliated entity(ies) may not take part in more than one application.</p> <p>Please tell me does it mean that we can have just one application from our Faculty or that we can expect only one project to be awarded? Please, could you give us more specific information about this? Is this right or not?</p>	<p>Also, in sections 2.1.1 and 2.1.2 is clearly stated which types of organizations are eligible to be applicants, co-applicants and affiliated entities in this Call for Proposals</p> <p>Please refer in particular to section 2.2.2 (1) :</p> <p><i>(1) In order to be eligible for a grant, the applicant must:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>be non-profit-making legal persons established by public or private law for the purposes of public interest or specific purpose of meeting needs of general interest, which is proven by statute and/or articles of association/decision on establishment, of the respective institution in accordance with relevant law, and</i> <p>....</p>

"Submission of supporting documents for provisionally selected applications" and its part referring to works:</p> <p>"For all applicants whose projects involve the execution of works, the following documents will be required in addition:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. All necessary legal authorization required by applicable law (location permit; construction permits, etc.) 2. Positive decision on Environment Impact Assessment / statement form the relevant public authority that the latter is

Proof of ownership or long term lease (10 years after the signature of the contract= of the land / assets. 4. Preliminary Works Design or Detailed Works Design. 5. Indicative Priced Bill of Quantities – calculated in EUR. <p>The requested supporting document must be supplied in the form of originals, photocopies or scanned versions (i.e. showing legible stamps, signatures and dates) of the said originals.</p> <p>“ If the abovementioned supporting documents are not provided before the deadline indicated in the request for supporting documents sent to the applicant by the Contracting Authorities, the application may be rejected.”</p> <p>Supporting documents will be requested from all pre-selected applicants after the conclusion of the first evaluation step. Applicant should obtain all necessary documents for submission by that time.</p>
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
